Today's Cooking Lesson: Tired of Rubbery Eggs?

According to <u>Cook's Illustrated</u>, it's easy to make really great scrambled eggs. You know the kind. They have those nice pillow-like curds, which are cooked all the way through without browning them.

The trick is to start the eggs cooking over a medium-high heat. Then when your spatula leaves a trail through the eggs, reduce the heat to low and cook for 30-60 seconds more. Enjoy!

Revive your Greens!

Stop tossing those wilted greens that you just paid an arm & a leg for! Simply use cold water to revive veggies like broccoli, asparagus, celery, scallions, stemmed basil and parsley too! It's best to trim a little off the stems, then soak for about an hour. Softer greens, like lettuce, spinach & arugula, can be soaked 30 minutes in ice water. With grocery prices so high these days, you'll want to make sure you're eating, rather than tossing, your greens.
