Next Up: the Peabody Essex Museum in Salem!

Their website explains that the <u>Peabody Essex Museum</u> "was founded in 1799 by a group of Salem sea captains and merchants. It was originally created to house society's collection of books, maps, and artifacts from around the world." More recently, the PEM houses "more than 1.5 million objects, including maritime artifacts, Asian art, and American art."

While it would be hard to see all of those objects in one visit, we hope that you'll join us as we travel on our private coach and head north on <u>Thursday, April 25,</u> <u>2024</u> to enjoy the PEM's treasures!


