Fall Town Meeting takes place on <u>Monday</u>, <u>November 13th</u> and your voice is needed as we vote on Brewster's Local Comprehensive Plan as revised and submitted by the Brewster Vision Planning Committee.

As a Brewster resident, you have the opportunity to consider and vote on Brewster's Local Comprehensive Plan (LCP) at Town Meeting. The plan was developed by Brewster citizens as a guide to prepare for the future by balancing priorities and advancing issues that we care about as a community. *The Plan is not law or regulation*. Rather it **provides recommendations and guidance** for decision-making by elected officials and Town management.

These recommendations are included in the LCP Action Plan — the heart of the LCP — which defines the range of issues Brewster citizens have already deemed important to discuss and tackle in the coming decade and beyond. (Please note that following the 2022 Fall Town Meeting and 2023 Special Town Meeting, all references to pursuing a proposed boardwalk to Wing Island have been removed from the Plan.) Any future actions that involve bylaw changes or appropriation will go to Town Meeting for your vote.
