# With all the Talk about Audits...

Do you ever fish around in your wallet for the best credit card to use? Maybe you like one that gives you airline miles or sends you a check at the end of the year. It's good to perform an audit of your wallet so you'll know what cards you're carrying and to limit how many are in your wallet in case of loss or theft.

Good advice provided by the AARP includes making sure you leave your Social Security and Medicare cards home unless you absolutely need them. Other cards in your wallet should be photocopied (front & back) & those copies put somewhere very safe in your home (and tell a trusted relative/friend where you've hidden the info ②). That way, if you wallet is lost or stolen, you'll have immediate access to the information you need to report your loss to the credit card company or the police. *Don't put your wallet audit off! Do it today!*

# There is so much to see and do at the New Bedford Whaling Museum!

There are so many permanent exhibits at the <u>New Bedford Whaling Museum</u>, you're bound to find a room with something of interest to you! Whales Today. The Old Dartmouth Historical Society. Harboring Hope. 18th Century Kitchen. Captain Paul Cuffy. Energy & Enterprise. East Meets West. Scrimshaw. Cultures of Whaling. A Voyage Around the World - The Lagoda. A Voyage Around the World - The Balcony! Whew!

"The New Bedford Whaling Museum was originally opened in 1903 to house and display artifacts relevant to the whaling industry. Governed by the Old Dartmouth Historical Society, the museum collection contains more than 750,000 items, including



3,000 pieces of scrimshaw and 2,500 logbooks, both of which are the largest collections in the world" according to information on their <u>site</u> and the National Park Service site.

We'll travel off-Cape to the museum by coach on **Tuesday, April 29, 2025**, departing **from the Brewster Baptist Church at 8:30 AM.** Parking in the back lot nearest to the Library, is free. We'll return from our enjoyable trip between 2:30 to 3 PM.

The trip includes museum admission, a guided tour plus additional time to visit the rest of the museum, and the gift shop, too. You'll also have time to explore the surrounding scenic New Bedford. Lunch is on your own, and we'll have a list of nearby restaurants that we'll share on the bus. Avoid the traffic and join us for an interesting day!
